#### **FALL WORSHIP**

Jesus as our companion August 13 – September 24, 2017 Assembly Mennonite Church

What a great summer of stories, music and reflection focused on how we are *Rooted in Love*. We now ready ourselves for a new season: a new school and church year. We will have opportunities to welcome each other, to share our gifts, and to learn together. This year we will transform our physical space. We will be building the road as we go.

Along the road, we will focus on stories about Jesus and on stories that Jesus tells. Later we will consider images of Jesus. During this fall worship we will

focus on *Jesus as our Companion*. The stories will remind us of how Jesus builds relationships and trust. We will see how the dominant expression of his love is as one who sits at the table with us.

In our congregational life together we will be examining our structural relationships and staffing patterns through the bridge work that Tom Kauffman is doing with us. As such

we will be examining how Assembly builds relationships and trust. What do we need to be intentional about as we grow? How can we carry and acknowledge fundamental needs people have for healing of many types? As the Milk and Honey Campaign reminds us, we are operating out of a mindset of abundance rather than scarcity. It will require time and energy as we build church together. How might we meet God together in this space? As we end the calendar year, our facility will be undergoing significant remodeling. We will truly be "building the road as we go."

As we think of *Jesus as our companion* we are reminded of John 14:18-20 and Jesus' promise to the disciples: "I will not leave you orphaned; I am coming to you. In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me; because I live, you also will live. On that day you will know that I am in my Father, and you in me, and I in you."(NRSV)

These texts from the New Testament remind us of how Jesus defined companionship as well as how he resisted certain definitions of the relationship.

### **Sunday morning schedule:**

The worship committee is committed to having a consistent starting and ending time for worship and Sunday school. 9:30AM 1<sup>st</sup> hour begins, which includes:

Children's time for ages 3 and up during the worship service Children's time for those under 3 in the childcare room

Childcare for ages 3 and younger after children's time until the end of 1st hour

10:45AM 1<sup>st</sup> hour concludes and children are dismissed to Sunday School

Children are picked up (and signed out) from childcare, so space can transition to Sunday school.

11:00AM 2<sup>nd</sup> hour begins for adults

11:50AM: Sunday school teachers bring children back to the worship space.

## Other things to remember:

\*\* If you are seated in the north section, you can help with the transition to 2<sup>nd</sup> hour by taking personal items with you at the end of 1<sup>st</sup> hour and stacking your song books near the sound cart. All who are willing can help by carrying chairs from the north section to the rolling cart.

### \*\* Guidelines for announcements:

• Use the Assemblyline as the first, best source for announcements since it can be accessed by those who weren't present in worship or were focused on small

children. Deadline is 8AM Friday at assemblyline@assemblymennonite.org

• We are continuing the summer experiment of having the worship leader read announcements, while all are still present. <u>Announcement request forms</u> are available on the small table beside the mailboxes, on tan half-sheets. Please hand these directly to the worship leader before the service or during the offering. If you have a creative or dramatic announcement that you would like to share, please talk to the worship leader prior to Sunday morning.

\*\* If you choose to continue in conversation during second hour, please move to areas without carpeting, as these happen to also be the spots that have the least sound overflow into 2<sup>nd</sup> hour and Sunday school rooms.
