Zoom Cluster Worship is a more intimate, participatory form of online worship at Assembly. Each Sunday from Jan 16-Feb 20 we will worship at 10 AM in groups of 16-20 households. This will allow everyone to be seen on one screen, and will move away from "watching a performance" of worship done somewhere else. The sermon, children's time, and music will be pre-recorded and shared by the tech host; you can volunteer to read or pray, and you can respond to the sermon and share prayer requests. Join via the same Zoom link as always, and then join a cluster group (breakout room). Breakout rooms are assigned by small group, or last name (for those not in small groups). There will also be a breakout room for children, hosted by a member of the Christian Education committee, and using content related to that week's theme. (Children may also choose to join a cluster group with their parents).

Our sermon this Sunday is from Gwen Gustafson-Zook. Gwen is a former member of Assembly, and is currently working as a chaplain in Portland, Oregon. Gwen is also serving as Assembly's "congregational spiritual director" (formerly known as "alongside-seer"); she meets regularly with the Assembly pastoral team, and is also a resource as needed for the Leadership Group.

But we're hoping the larger Assembly family will also help us welcome them to our community. Building Tithe Proposal: Assembly decided in 2015 that our fundraising for the building project (which included the completion of the new worship space in 2019) would "include a tithe benefiting those in the body of Christ who cannot afford a renovation project like ours." In December 2017 the congregation decided to give the first half of this tithe to Join Hands (https://www.mennonitemen.org/JoinHands/). The second half of the tithe was to be given away after the building project was completed. The ad hoc building tithe committee is Leon Bauman, Scott Coulter, & Eric Yordy. We propose giving the second half of this tithe also to Join Hands. The mission of that organization fits closely with the goal of our building tithe.
