<u>MapMaker: Redlining in the United States | National Geographic Society</u>. Redlining maps created in the 1930s depicting the government classification of neighborhoods as "best," "still desirable," "definitely declining," and "hazardous," which impacted available government-insured financing. Redlining was/is a racially discriminatory and, now, illegal practice of devaluing homes in racially mixed or neighborhoods with few or no white residents. It impacted homeownership and its impacts can still be seen today.
