HEARING ASSISTANCE

This worship space has two systems to help people with hearing loss participate more fully in our life together.

<u>1. FM system.</u> Get a receiver and an ear speaker from the sound booth. <u>2. Hearing Loop accessed by hearing aids with t-coils.</u> Find a seat in the worship space and turn on the t-coils in your hearing aids. (You do not need a receiver or headphones.) Talk to someone in the sound booth if you are having issues receiving the signal.
