Over the next year (September through May) we'll be using the Narrative Lectionary texts each week for our worship. The Narrative Lectionary follows the sweep of the biblical story, from Creation through the early Christian church.

The texts show the breadth and variety of voices within Scripture. They invite us to hear the stories of Abraham and Sarah, Moses and the prophets, Jesus and Paul. Listening to the many different voices within Scripture reminds us that the Bible is not a flat and one dimensional book and there is not just one dominant voice. The texts for the year are arranged in a narrative sequence to help

us see Scripture as a story that has coherence and dynamic movement. It is a story of God creating, redeeming, restoring. And it is a story of people who are complicated and wily, faithful and misguided, disobedient, petty and deeply committed.

We are aware that across the congregation there are a wide variety of feelings toward the Bible, running the gamut from antipathy, apathy, skepticism to vague knowledge, curiosity, openness, and even deep love. One of our goals during this year is to make space for all these feelings and to hear a variety of voices preaching on these ancient texts which we believe still hold relevance, wisdom and truth.

In this first series, we'll hear origin stories: stories that tell the beginnings of creation, the people of Israel, and the early religious practices of the ancient Israelites. What are our origin stories here at Assembly? How are we being shaped into a people of authentic and deeply grounded faith? What are the new ideas or ways of being that we are wrestling with?

Goals: Increase biblical literacy, tell the whole Bible story, less frantic worship planning, hear some new texts, try something new
