THE PROMISE OF TRANSFORMATION

Luke 13:18-21

"What is the kingdom of God like? What shall I compare it with? It is like a mustard seed which a man took and sowed in his garden; and it grew to be a tree and the birds came to roost in its branches."

Again he said, "The kingdom of God, what shall I compare it with? It is like yeast which a woman took and mixed into sixty pounds of flour until it was all leavened."

Sharing from The Kingdom of God Makes Room for All elective

In the grinding of the mustard we are reminded that we need transformation. That God is turning us into a new thing. But we can not do this alone. A single crushed mustard seed doesn't amount to anything. But when we are ground together millions of mustard seeds transformed, we become something zingy, and delicious that brings spice to the life of the world. Thank you, Lord, for this meal.
