(repeat) Since 1952, MCC has been blessed to own and operate the only known mobile cannery in the world. During this time, we have yielded over 36 million pounds of canned meat. A crucial part of the mobile cannery has always been MCC service workers. These volunteers donate two years of their time, traveling across the country and sharing this experience with the communities the mobile cannery visits. In recent years, it has become a considerable challenge finding service workers willing to fill this role. It is with some urgency that we look to fill three of the four canner operator positions are currently vacant. Time is growing short as we look towards the beginning of our next canning season in October.
