COVID-19 Updates

COVID Testing Recommendations. Over the past month, many people at Assembly have tested positive for COVID, and some have gotten fairly sick. For your safety, we're reminding you of [these recommendations](#) from the Assembly COVID-19 Advisory Task Force:

- If you develop ANY symptoms, even very mild ones, test yourself for COVID. If you test negative, repeat the test over the next several days to decrease the risk of having a false negative test.
- If you test positive for COVID, immediately call your primary care provider. We now have several oral treatments and several infusion treatments that decrease the chance that high-risk people end up hospitalized or dying from COVID-19. **The sooner the treatments are started, the better they work.** Some need to be started within 5 days of your first symptoms.

Mask Policy: Masks are still required during worship for everyone ages 2 and older. [Our COVID Advisory Committee](#) encourages everyone to be aware of the risks of attending large gatherings, particularly for those who are immunocompromised or unvaccinated.

Child Vaccinations and Assembly's Mask Policy. Many of us are celebrating that our young children (6 months - 5 years-old) are now eligible to receive COVID-19 vaccines. Young children who recently received the first dose of the vaccine will be fully vaccinated in early September - early November, depending on the timing of the multiple doses. We anticipate having some congregational discussion of our mask policy sometime this fall as children become fully vaccinated.
