	Religion of Creation	Religion of Empire
Purpose of religion	To be grounded in a relationship with the Creator God for the blessing and abundance of <i>all</i> people and <i>all</i> creation	Claims the God of creation but its purpose is to legitimate a god who provides blessing and abundance for <i>some</i> at the expense of <i>others</i>
Places of sacred encounter	Mountains, wilderness, rivers, direct encounter, table fellowship	Urban temple, mediated by priestly elite; urban royal rituals
God's "home"	Beyond and within creation and among people	In a temple near the palace in the royal city
Life's purpose	Praise God with joy in gratitude for God's gifts	Serve the gods through loyalty to empire
Relationship with others	Hospitality; love	Suspicion, violence
Relationship with land	Belongs to God; people are "tenants"	Belongs to king and those who can afford to buy it
Relationship with "enemies"	Love them	Destroy them
